SENIOR CLASS MEETINGS College Application Process

- College Application Process for students applying to a 4-year college
 - How many schools should I apply to? Each student is different...for some students, 1-2 applications might work best, while other students may apply to 5-6 schools. We do recommend:
 - At least 1 New Jersey School Many grants, scholarships, etc. are designed for NJ residents only
 - One safe school (i.e. your academic profile exceeds the colleges requirements; check out average SAT and GPA)
 - Keep in mind that most application fees are \$50 or more; narrow down your list before you begin applying
 - Common Application (<u>www.commonapp.org</u>)
 - Standardized first-year application form used to apply to many colleges with a single application
 - Accepted by more than 500 colleges
 - Many colleges request additional "supplements" through Common App
 - o Request transcripts online through Naviance
- Admission Options
 - Early Decision
 - Legally binding
 - Must attend if accepted
 - If you are accepted, you must withdraw all other college applications
 - Early Action
 - Not legally binding
 - Earlier deadline than regular admission with early decision delivery
 - o Regular Admission
 - Rolling applications are evaluated as they are received
 - Deadline applications are only reviewed after a single deadline date
- College Application Components
 - o Online admission application
 - Submit an online application for each school you are applying to, using the college's online application or their application through Common App (if applicable)
 - o SAT scores
 - YOU are responsible for sending your SAT scores
 - YOU must log on to your unique CollegeBoard account and request to have your scores sent; we cannot send SAT scores for you (they are only accepted by schools when they are sent directly through your CollegeBoard account).
 - When you register for the SATs, be sure to enter the names of the schools where you plan to apply (the CollegeBoard will issue up to 4 reports for free)
 - Make sure you send scores directly from CollegeBoard to the colleges where you are applying
 - CollegeBoard will charge an additional \$11.25 per score report requested (beyond the 4 you indicated on your initial registration)
 - o Transcript
 - GPA
 - Class Rank
 - Strength/rigor of classes you have taken in 9th-12th grade

- o Resume
 - Submit the resume you created in your English class to your counselor for your college application file
 - You may also take advantage of the resume builder feature in Naviance
- o Letters of Recommendation
 - If you are using Common App, be sure to check how many recommendations each individual college requires (most require at least 1 TEACHER recommendation)
 - Ask for letters of recommendation ASAP!
 - Provide your recommender with your resume so he/she may tailor the letter to include your most important qualities, activities, strengths, etc.
 - Be sure to write a thank you note for your recommender
- o Essay
 - Tailor to each individual college as needed
 - PROOFREAD
- Extracurricular activities, athletics, honors & awards (you will include this info on your resume and applications)
- NCAA Clearinghouse application
 - For students who intend to play collegiate sports for a Division I or Division II school
 - Visit <u>eligibilitycenter.org</u> to apply
- DEADLINES
 - \circ $\;$ You are responsible for keeping track of when your applications are due
 - o APPLY EARLY! You should plan to submit all four year college applications before winter break
 - Transcript requests and requests to mail recommendation letters are due to your counselor at least one week prior to the application deadline. All requests must be in by December 12th in order for your transcripts to be submitted and recommendations to be mailed before winter break. Requests received after December 10th may not be processed until January 4th.
- Visiting College Campuses
 - Be sure to get a letter from the College Admissions Office
 - Ask the Admissions Officer about an application fee waiver
- Do Senior year grades matter??? YES!!!!!!!
 - o 1st marking period grades will be sent with transcripts
 - o Most colleges will also ask for mid-year and final grades
 - If your grades are suffering, seek help!
 - See your teacher for extra help
 - Talk to your counselor
 - Many colleges/universities will rescind offer of admission if a student slacks off in his/her senior year
- Naviance
 - Log on regularly for updates on scholarships, college visits, etc.
 - Request transcripts via Naviance
 - o Remember we can NOT send your SAT scores; you must send them directly from the CollegeBoard
 - Check out the Naviance resume builder
 - Click on the "About Me" tab and then on the "Resume" link
 - The resume builder includes tips on writing, type of information to include, layout, etc.
- Camden County College
 - CCC is one of the top community colleges in the nation and is a great option for many students:
 - Students who want to save \$\$\$ while completing their general education courses before transferring to a 4-year college
 - Students who are undecided about a college major and/or career path

- Students who want to earn an Associate's Degree or professional certificate in a specific career program or trade (e.g. dental hygiene, automotives, medical assistant, etc.)
- NJSTARS program: Students who graduate in the top 15% of their class are eligible to attend Camden County College tuition-free for 2 years
- Steps for students planning to attend Camden County College
 - Submit CCC application online in January/February 2016
 - Attend CCC College for a Day Field Trip in March 2016:
 - Accuplacer Placement test and score reports
 - Meet with CCC staff
 - Lunch in the café
 - Cost is only \$5 for the day!!
 - Meet with CCC Academic Advisor at Audubon HS in June 2016 to register for CCC classes
- College Admissions and Social Media
 - \circ Be very mindful of the type of impression you make with your social media profiles
 - Many schools have a policy that admissions can be revoked if a student engages in behavior that calls into question his/her honesty, maturity, character, morals, judgment, etc.

 - Avoid using an unprofessional email address (i.e. XXNJhottie21@yahoo.com vs. JSmith@gmail.com)
- Scholarships
 - Check out <u>www.fastweb.com</u> and <u>https://bigfuture.collegeboard.org/scholarship-search</u> for a wide array of national scholarship opportunities
 - Scholarships will be posted on Naviance check your email & account regularly!
 - Local scholarships will be available around March 2016
 - o Listen for PA announcements in homeroom
 - Pick up applications for local scholarships (starting in March 2016) in the Guidance Office
- Financial Aid
 - Complete and submit the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) at http://www.fafsa.ed.gov/
 - Apply starting in January 2016
 - Financial Aid Info session for parents will be held in January 2016
 - Wait to eliminate a college from your list because of cost because you don't know how your financial aid package will look
 - o CSS Profile (College Scholarship Service profile)
 - The financial aid application service of the College Board
 - More than 400 colleges and universities use the information to determine eligibility for NONfederal student aid
 - More detailed than FASFA
 - Has an app fee of \$25 plus \$16 for each college or scholarship program to which you want info sent
 - You must check if the colleges you are applying to require you to submit the CSS profile (deadlines are typically in the fall – check ASAP!)
